Immunizations are available for students during the school year at both schools\*.

*\*Parents must fill out forms and provide consent prior to child receiving vaccine(s).*

Section 23-07-17.1 section of North Dakota State Law mandates all students in kindergarten through grade twelve meet a minimum number of required immunizations prior to school entrance. If you have a child entering Kindergarten, 7th grade, or 11th grade please contact us to schedule their school required vaccinations.

- D. Cribs for Kids: Pack-n-Play education and free distribution
- E. Emergency Preparedness and Response Program

- G. Reproductive Health Services: income-based, insurance accepted

- I. Foot Care Services: Inspection of feet with nail trimming and filing
